*You are cordially invited to a luncheon presentation featuring four leading journalists from the East-West Center's Northeast Asia Journalists Seminar, who will address the impact and aftermath of the Olympics on China.*

**Kang Bing**, an EWC alumnus, is the Deputy Editor-in-Chief of *China Daily*, the only national English language newspaper in China. Previously Kang worked as a sports reporter and editor, covering the Olympic Games, Asian Games and the World Cup. He served as vice-chairman of the Chinese Sports Journalists' Association and a consultant to the department of the Beijing Olympic Organizing Committee.

**Haili Cao**, an EWC alumna, is the Foreign Editor of *Caijing Magazine*, a Beijing-based financial publication. She is currently a Nieman Fellow with Harvard University. Cao has covered issues ranging from business to corruption to public health, and now international news. She has won awards for her SARS coverage in Southern China in 2003 and more recently has been tracking the avian flu outbreak in China and worldwide. Prior to *Caijing* magazine, she worked at *HuaSheng Monthly* (Voice of Overseas Chinese) in Beijing.

**Josephine Ma** is the Beijing Correspondent for *South China Morning Post*, the main English language daily newspaper in Hong Kong, regarded as a leading commentator on Greater China. In recent months, she has covered the Sichuan earthquake and its aftermath, and the impact of the Olympics on Beijing including security and protests in the city and among Tibetans in Lhasa.

**Mark Magnier** is the Beijing Bureau Chief for the *L.A. Times*. He first served as a Tokyo correspondent before being posted to Beijing in 2003. He also has done crisis reporting in Iraq, Israel and the West Bank, Timor-Leste, Kashmir and Sri Lanka. During his five years in China, he has covered the Tibet riots, the Sichuan earthquake and the Olympics.
